- Must have minimum of 480 hours working directly with children in a classroom setting of a state licensed child care center or registered family home.

A CDA is a Child Development Associate, a person who has successfully completed the CDA assessment process and has been awarded the CDA Creden-

tial. A CDA performs according to the CDA Competency Goals in center-based, home visitor or family child care programs.
